You should know:

After selecting a plate, if you modify the image size in the Designer, or combine it with text, or....?, you will be creating a new plate.

I keep struggling with why we have text and placeholder within the popup. The text box in particular feels a little like a "designer within a designer" - but I *think* I get it - the pop-up provides the needed interface for choosing a plate or an image. (which you can only initiate from the Designer). But it also serves the purpose of helping the user, immediately after they choose Registered/ Repeat, who may be a little stumped or overwhelmed about how to get started - in which case, we need to present all the choices, including text and placeholder. Have I got that right?

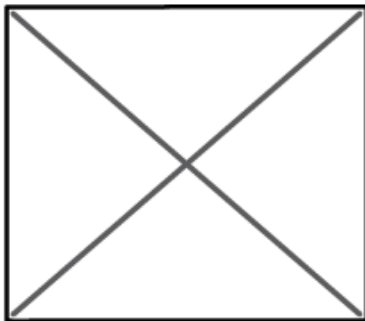

Tip:

You can edit and reformat your text in the Designer.

You can also combine it with an image.

Again, this feels to me like a designer within a designer - it's sort of confusing, since I can X'out of this and click a button to to do the same thing, right? The Tip is an attempt to explain this, as well as the concept of combining text and images (they can do that, right?)

No artwork? No sweat!

You can get going without an image, but in order to work with the Designer, you need a "placeholder" to work with (so you can position it on the product, see how it will look, choose ink colors, etc.)

Ditto some of the things I said on the Text sticky note. On the other hand, I think that this gives us an opportunity to make clear that you really don't need in an image to get started - via the text in the tab, and the text in the margin. (An alternative way of doing that is just saying it right on the canvas... I think we rejected that approach but do not recall why.)

When should I start with an existing plate?

Start with an existing plate if you've printed this before and all of the image dimensions, text, etc. are remaining exactly the same.

Or, choose an existing plate as a starting point for a new plate. For example, you'd like to use the Laddawn stock recycling logo, but you'd like it to be a different size. You can choose it, then resize it, add text, or make other modifications in the Designer. You can do this with your custom plates as well.

Still not sure?

We know you may be quoting with incomplete information. Whether you start with an existing plate, a new image, some text, or a placeholder - you can always change your print design later.
