• Later that day...Edith gives Print Designer a whirl, but wonders if she can use it in this situation.




• Edith quickly gives in and calls Laddawn.

• Edith feels a momentary sense of relief from being able to answer Denzel's next question.




• Denzel hits a snag. Quick Price is disabled on the long side.

• Denzel and Mollie briefly confer over whether number of sides matters for pricing.




 Mollie remembers one time that she opened a ticket about pricing not changing when adding printing to another side. Lee told her and Tim that it matters for some categories and not others.




• Denzel adds the rectangle to the long side and explains that to Edith.

- More importantly, how does he get the total colors to five?




• Mollie explains to Denzel how to get the correct total color count using the rectangle workaround.

• At the last screen before getting results, Denzel ponders an alternative to Mollie's color count solution. But it feels like it raises more questions than it answers.




• Denzel generates Edith's quote and discusses the next step.
